Hazardous Waste Operations and Emergency Response (HAZWOPER) Training (40 hours) (OSHA 29 CFR 1910.120)

This comprehensive training is recommended for employees that have a potential for hazardous material exposure. It meets off-site training requirements for general site workers. This course is approved by the National Institute of Environmental Health Sciences. Key subjects include properties of hazardous materials and wastes; selection, use and care of personal protective equipment; site safety and health responsibilities, plans and procedures and decontamination procedures and methods.

Hazard Communication

This customized training is required by OSHA for employees who are exposed to chemicals on the job. The course teaches students to identify types of chemicals, the ways chemicals can enter the body, and the methods used by the employer to protect employees from any hazards caused by the chemicals. This training is based on an employer's written plan and utilizes Material Safety Data Sheets supplied by chemical manufacturers.

Lockout/Tagout

Students will learn about OSHA-required Lockout/Tagout programs. Employers who require employees to work on machines must implement a Lockout/Tagout program. Maintenance employees will be trained in safe repair practices and machine operators will be trained in general safety awareness. Training is based on an employer's written program and will be specific to each machine in an employer's facility.

Hazardous Waste Operations Refresher Training (8 hours) (OSHA 29 CFR 1910.120)

This class provides refresher training as well as necessary information updates. Approved by the National Institute of Environmental Health Sciences this class can be customized to fit the needs of individual companies.

Walking and Working Surfaces / Slips, Trips and Falls

Students will learn to be aware of the risks of slips, trips and falls, which have been identified by OSHA as the cause of many accidents on the job. They will learn about aisles and walkways, stairways, fixed and portable ladders as well as proper housekeeping to safely maintain walking and working surfaces.

OSHA Safety Training Program

Manufacturers implementing a safety meeting program will benefit from customized training. Wright College will assign an instructor to an employer's facility who will work with the manufacturer's personnel to design a safety meeting schedule that addresses the particular health, safety and environmental training needs of the facility. Training will be based on OSHA driven requirements as well as internal company goals and objectives. Topics can include machine guarding, hazard communication, personal protective equipment, lockout/tagout, bloodborne pathogens and walking and working surfaces. Such a program can be very successful in reducing work-related accidents and injuries.
